Findings:

- IUCN has refocused the Nepal programme to be rooted in the rural realities of Nepal, but has moved away from its area of competence: knowledge.
- IUCN is generating knowledge based on its work with partners in Nepal, but this needs to become stronger within Nepal and better at distilling lessons from that work to the world at large.
- Political situation in Nepal is unstable and has implications for IUCN's work.
- IUCN Nepal had benefited from its links to the IUCN Asia Regional Programme and the Global Programmes.

Recommendations:

- Consolidate the shift from global policy to field emphasis in the programme
- Re-affirm knowledge as the central concept of the programme and simplify the conceptual framework
- Accept the long-term nature of achieving results and maintain the strategy of working through partners to achieve conservation and livelihood results
- Maintain continuity of results by maintaining a low profile and working through partners.
- Future cooperation with SDC should continue on the present basis, albeit through a more focused programme.
