# 12 Tips For Getting Your Grant Idea Funded

#### 1. Read the ecosystem profile.

Reading the hotspot's ecosystem profile — or, at a minimum, the chapter on investment strategy and program focus — will h determine if your project is a good fit for CEPF before you put time and energy into writing an LOI.

"We have to focus on certain places and on certain types of activities so that we can have a measurable impact and not spreatoo thinly," said Managing Director Jack Tordoff. "Nearly 50 percent of the proposals I've reviewed were rejected simply becafit the scope of the call."

It's also important to closely read through the call for proposals itself. Pay particular attention to the evaluation criteria. "The proposal to demonstrate how well it fulfills the evaluation criteria ultimately will determine whether it is approved or not," Granichele Zador said.
